Tasks will include preparation of microbial growth media, preparation of Agar plates and production of Antibiotic stock solutions. You may also perform routine molecular biological assays such as PCR, DNA and RNA extractions. You will work under both S1 and S2 safety levels, in which you will be fully trained at the MPI. Your work will also include organization of the laboratory in the form of updating lists for common stocks. Your work will be part of research projects in a fast-paced and diversified work environment.

Qualifications:

Applicants should be (i) highly motivated with a strong work ethic, (ii) a team player, (iii) organized and good at time management, (iv) eager to learn new techniques. At a minimum, applicants should have previous experience with standard techniques of molecular biology (e.g., pipetting, DNA and RNA extractions, PCR, gel electrophoresis) and with common office productivity programs (e.g., Microsoft Office).
